# Loligo Squid Fishery 

Closure of Trimester 2 Directed Fishery
Effective August 23, 2011
As of 0001 hours, August 23, 2011, vessels issued Federal Loligo squid (Loligo) permits may not possess or land more than $2,500 \mathrm{lb}$ of Loligo until the start of Trimester 3 on September 1, 2011. Federally permitted dealers may not purchase more than $2,500 \mathrm{lb}$ of Loligo from 0001 hours, August 23, 2011, until the start of Trimester 3 on September 1, 2011.

## Frequently Asked Questions:

## How much of the Trimester 2 Loligo quota has been harvested?

Based on dealer landings, 90 percent of the 2011 Trimester 2 Loligo quota will be harvested by August 23, 2011. Although Trimester 3 starts on September 1, 2011, the regulations require that we close the Trimester 2 directed Loligo fishery when landings are projected to reach 90 percent of the quota.

Is this closure because of the butterfish mortality cap?
No. There is a butterfish mortality cap in the Loligo fishery, but Trimester 2 of the Loligo fishery is closing because 90 percent of the Trimester 2 Loligo quota has been harvested. As of August 10, 2011, only $1,216,050 \mathrm{lb}$, or 38.4 percent of the $3,165,838 \mathrm{lb}$ annual butterfish mortality cap quota has been harvested. This means that $1,949,788 \mathrm{lb}$, or 61.6 percent of the butterfish mortality cap, will be available for the Loligo fishery during Trimester 3 (September 1 - December 31, 2011).

## Can I land any Loligo during this closure?

Yes, you can possess and land up to 2,500 lb of Loligo from 0001 hours, August $23-31^{\text {st }}, 2011$.
