RE Soliciting Information and Comment for Economic Analysis Related to Defining

Excessive Shares in the Northeast Multispecies Fishery

Compass Lexecon has been asked to provide independent advice to the New England Fishery Management Council to help the Council evaluate potential excessive share limits in the Northeast multispecies fishery. The study is being led by economists Dr. Glenn Mitchell and Dr. Steven Peterson of Compass Lexecon.
