- ADVISORY PANEL APPLICANTS WANTED: The New England Fishery Management Council is encouraging
 all interested stakeholders to consider serving on an advisory panel (AP). Executive Director Tom Nies
 said, "Our advisory panels are extremely important to our process. They help Council members make
 more informed decisions. We're looking for applicants who understand their fisheries and are ready to
 commit to an active role on an AP."
 - The Council has APs that support the following committees: groundfish, scallops, monkfish, Atlantic herring, habitat, skates, whiting, deep-sea red crab, and enforcement.
 - O New applicants are highly encouraged. Current advisors who wish to continue serving must reapply to express their interest.
 - O The application deadline is August 31, 2019.

- GROUNDFISH CATCH SHARE PROGRAM REVIEW: Three more opportunities remain available for

 - East Hampton, NY Wednesday, August 21 at the East Hampton Town Hall, 159 Pantigo Road, beginning at 4:00 p.m. NOTE: This is a revised date, location, and start-time for New York.
- ECOSYSTEM-BASED FISHERY MANAGEMENT (EBFM) MSE: The Council's EBFM Committee is working on an example Fishery Ecosystem Plan (eFEP) for Georges Bank. As part of this effort, the Council will be using a Management Strategy Evaluation (MSE) process to solicit stakeholder input and participation. The Council has established a new MSE Steering Committee that is charged with developing: (1) terms of references for structuring the process; and (2) recommendations for how best to engage fishermen and other stakeholders and facilitate participation in the process. - **ECOSYSTEM-BASED FISHERY MANAGEMENT (EBFM) MSE CONTINUED:** The MSE Steering Committee will hold its first meeting on Wednesday, September 4 in Braintree, MA.

- **HABITAT:** The Council has updated its habitat webpage and posted new Quick Links for <u>Research</u> Objectives for the Great South Channel Habitat Management Area and the Fishing Effects Model.

- **COMMITTEE AND ADVISORY PANEL MEETINGS:** In addition to EBFM, the Council has a full schedule of committee and advisory panel (AP) meetings lined up for August and September to work on actions related to groundfish, scallops, Atlantic herring, habitat, monkfish, and skates.
